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## Children's books about teasing

While Tami doesn't retaliate with aggression, her passivity might lead readers to believe that being nice and not speaking up is the only solution. The author thinks it's illogical that TJ acknowledges Tami as a great sister in the end. The book has been skipped by this reader because they don't want their child to be quiet and tolerate teasing. However, they agree that teaching kids to confront issues is important. A sibling dynamic where one person teases another is presented, along with the idea of talking it out instead of escalating the situation. We found a bunch of books from this series at a used bookstore and bought them all! My kids enjoy reading these for story time, but we also use them to discuss when they exhibit a particular behavior. Each book explains the action, how it makes people feel, and what to do about it. It helps both parties, whether the child is being teased or doing the teasing. The books are simple, quick, and feature cute characters that my kids love. They show what can happen if we act in certain ways and provide a happier outcome when we try something different. As a kid I was constantly getting teased about my weight height and other stuff but instead of taking it seriously I'd just ignore them or come up with some witty comeback like "telling the bully I could diet but they'd need plastic surgery which usually shut them down!" This book is pretty useful not that I agree with everything in it but it's a good place to start especially since my mom used to read me stuff by Joy Wilt Berry when I was growing up and she's got some really helpful books for young kids. They explain things straight out and give you concrete steps on what to do which is great for little ones. I'm reading some of her books with my son right now and he actually picks them out himself at story time. She does a great job of breaking down big concepts into stuff that's easy for kids to understand sometimes we adults forget how different kids see the world. The pictures in these books are really cool too they help keep little ones engaged while teaching them valuable lessons which is perfect for home or classroom use and I think it'd be awesome if the community center where I work had a copy. I'm also super excited that they're making some of these available as ebooks! This particular book tells the story of a boy who was teasing his sister about her clothes then she gets tired of it and wants to talk about it but doesn't want to fight back because that'll just make things worse. It's really helpful for kids who get teased a lot. I bought this from the Friends of the Library and I voluntarily chose to review it giving it 4.5 stars there's lots of useful info in here especially for little ones. However some people might not find this particular book super effective maybe because they were never taught these things as kids or maybe because it doesn't tell them to go get an adult right away if someone's being really mean. I've seen teenagers and even adults benefit from reading these "Let's Talk About . ." books which is pretty cool. Some people might not like this book as much as others I hated it when I was a kid but that's probably because I didn't know how to handle all the teasing back then. This special collection of five books helps kids deal with hurtful stuff and learn what they can do if someone's being mean or excluding them. It also teaches readers the difference between bullying and just normal teasing and when it's time to get an adult involved.
